




Thank you for your interest in The Bright Side Family's 2022 Annual Report! It is always a pleasure to report on our activities, new programs and partnerships, our finances and leadership. We are also grateful for an opportunity to acknowledge the tremendous support we receive from our community including Foundations, businesses, houses of worship. State and local government and individuals. It is this support that enables The Bright Side Family to provide CARE WITHOUT CONDITIONS.

We were very excited to launch our first County-wide program in early 2022, a free budget management program called Senior Checks. Senior Checks works one-on-one with older adults who need help with managing monthly

budgets, paying bills, avoiding scams, and connecting with financial resources that can help them stretch their fixed incomes and ensure they can pay for housing, food, and health care. We served far more clients than we projected in 2022 and look forward to the program's continued growth and expansion.



Age Friendly Teaneck was able to re-energize its programs and activities after some had to be paused during the COVID pandemic. We were especially excited to resume our Careers in Aging Summer Internship Program and enjoyed having 4 high school students spend a month with us learning about the vast array of careers that involve serving the needs of older adults, including careers in health care, law, pharmacy, architecture, nutrition, and technology. We have been actively participating County- wide and State-wide efforts to ensure that New Jersey is a great place for people of all ages and abilities.

Late in the year, we broke ground for our newest project, construction of a 40-unit affordable senior apartment building in the Northeast neighborhood of Teaneck. This project will include a ground floor community center within which The Bright Side Family will provide vibrant programs and services for older adults residing in the building and surrounding community.

As the needs of older adults in Northern New Jersey continue to grow and evolve, so will our organization. We welcome opportunities to develop new programs and facilities and are tremendously grateful to the support of our Board of Directors, our funders, volunteers and all the men and women who work within The Bright Side Family.






